

Distribution List — Send it everywhere

Who to send the AISH-to-ADAP legal package to, and how to tailor the ask for each. Direct emails included where available.

How to use this. The cover letter has a bracketed “What I am asking of you” line — tailor it per category (legal = take carriage / advise; oversight = investigate; UN = receive as a submission / interim measures; political = act / halt the transition; media = cover this). Attach the four documents to each. **Verify each current email on the organization's own website before sending** — direct addresses change. Send the ones most likely to act first (legal clinics, Ombudsman, your MLA, media) without waiting to reach all of them.

1. Legal — for carriage of a challenge or legal advice

Tailor the ask: to review these materials and advise on, or take carriage of, a Charter challenge.

Suggested sending sequence

1. **Now:** your MLA + Marie Renaud + the Ombudsman + one legal clinic (PILC or ARCH) + one reporter who already covered Bruce Johnson (Global / CTV).
2. **This week:** file the Alberta Human Rights complaint (Document 3); the broader legal and advocacy list; the Minister and the Premier.
3. **In parallel, with a disability-rights org's help:** the UN submission (Document 2), which is strongest when co-signed by an experienced organization.

Attach the four documents (Charter Challenge, UN CRPD Submission, Human Rights Complaint, Evidence Dossier) to each message. Keep a simple log — date sent, to whom, response. It becomes part of the record, including for the UN “exhaustion of domestic remedies” analysis.
